Our role as the National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) is to support women who are building many different types of construction careers. We support and empower women in construction, and we want to support and empower **YOU!** There are so many career paths and opportunities in the construction field. We can't wait to share some of those options with you and help you identify where your interests, strengths, and talents can take you.

Camp NAWIC will be a week-long career exploration experience intended for girls in the Pittsburgh area entering 8th-12th grade who are interested in learning about careers in construction. Camp NAWIC will explore apprenticeship-based skilled trades positions (electrician, carpenter, operating engineer, etc.), college-based careers (engineer, architect, etc.), and the wide variety of career paths available for young women entering the construction industry.

Camp participants will meet and interact with women construction professionals with all levels and types of experience, from apprentices to CEOs, to observe some amazing examples of women succeeding in construction.

Camp NAWIC will be hosted at the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Joint Apprenticeship Training Center (JATC), located at 5 Hot Metal Street, Pittsburgh, PA 15203. Participants will need to provide their own transportation to and from the JATC each day. Camp will begin promptly at 8am each morning and finish at 3:30pm each afternoon. Transportation to and from other training center locations during the day will be provided by Camp NAWIC via Pittsburgh Transportation Group.

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CAMP NAWIC 2024 RULES

Safety	The National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) and trade apprentice schools consider safety a core principle. Any camper that disregards safety rules and procedures will be asked to leave the program.
Dress Code	Campers must abide by the dress code of the construction industry: long pants, t-shirts, and closed-toed shoes. No dangling jewelry please, and you should be prepared to tie back long hair—anything that can become caught in a tool is a safety hazard.
Conduct	Campers who disrespect fellow campers, guest instructors, or instructors will be asked to leave. No profanity, headphones, or smoking/vaping is allowed.
Schedule/ Transportation	Camp begins promptly at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 3:30 p.m. Any changes to these hours will be communicated as soon as possible. All campers are responsible for transportation to and from the IBEW Local 5 Joint Apprenticeship Training Center (5 Hot Metal Street, Pittsburgh, PA 15203) each day. Transportation during camp hours will be provided to other training centers or field trips as needed throughout the week.
Meals	Lunch and assorted snacks will be provided for campers each day. <u>A parent or guardian is invited to attend the camp awards luncheon on Friday at 12:00pm.</u>
Water/ Hydration	A cooler filled with bottled water will be available for you to use throughout each day. Please drink it. Dehydration is an important safety issue in construction.

I understand that, as a condition to participate, my daughter must present evidence of medical insurance and I hereby state that she is covered by such insurance. I understand that Camp activities are intended to provide hands-on experience of a construction work environment. Weekly activities will include construction activities that may include, but are not limited to: electronics, PVC/metal pipe, brick/tile, painting, glass, carpentry, ironwork, and work with hand and power tools. Opportunities for climbing structures with a safety harness to simulate climbing in a construction environment (ironwork, electrical utility work, etc.) may be offered, but participation is optional.

In addition, off-site field trips to other training centers and construction facilities will be scheduled, and I consent to my daughter's transportation to and participation in these events.

I agree that my daughter is in sufficient health and physical condition to participate in physical activity and activities simulating construction work. I will inform Camp organizers of any medical conditions, dietary restrictions, etc. that may be relevant to her participation in Camp NAWIC activities.

In consideration of my daughter's being able to participate in this activity, I hereby waive and release camp directors, guest instructors, and industry partners and sponsors from any action should an injury occur.
